

Brand Friendly Embroidery Club – August Project

We will be making a sewing tool holder that looks like a binder.

Supplies Needed:

Fabric-

*Dark Solid Fabric for background that embroidery sits on (brown or black preferably)
two 9" x 14" rectangles and one 6" square.

*Contrasting Cover Fabric

2" x 6" rectangle for front and for middle spine

1 1/2" x 6" rectangle for middle and for back spine

Two 1 1/2" x 19" strips for the top and bottom borders

*Scraps for embroidery design appliqué

*Lining Fabric

8" x 18 3/4" rectangle

3 yds of 1/4" finished width binding. Pre-folded or home made. This is for the ties. (If making your own, you must make before class).

Presser Feet: Open Toe, Zipper Foot, and 1/4" (with or without guide)

8 embroidery threads/colors for the embroidery design & sewing thread to match the lining, spine, & binding.

Ultra Clean and Tear Stabilizer – enough to double layer appliqué embroider design and fit in a large Bernina hoop. (not the jumbo hoop)

Fiber Form – one 8" x 19" piece

Single sided light-weight fusible batting – 8" x 19" piece

Paper-backed fusible web (like Steam A Seam) – 8" x 19"

3" wide elastic, 19 1/4" long. We actually took an elastic pleated dress front of a girls dress and used this instead of elastic. If you do this, you will want to serge the edges of your fabric so they are finished and don't fray.

505 Spray

Straight pins, seam sealant, & wonder tape

Your sewing/embroidery machine and some basic sewing notions. Rotary cutter, mat and ruler are helpful as well.
